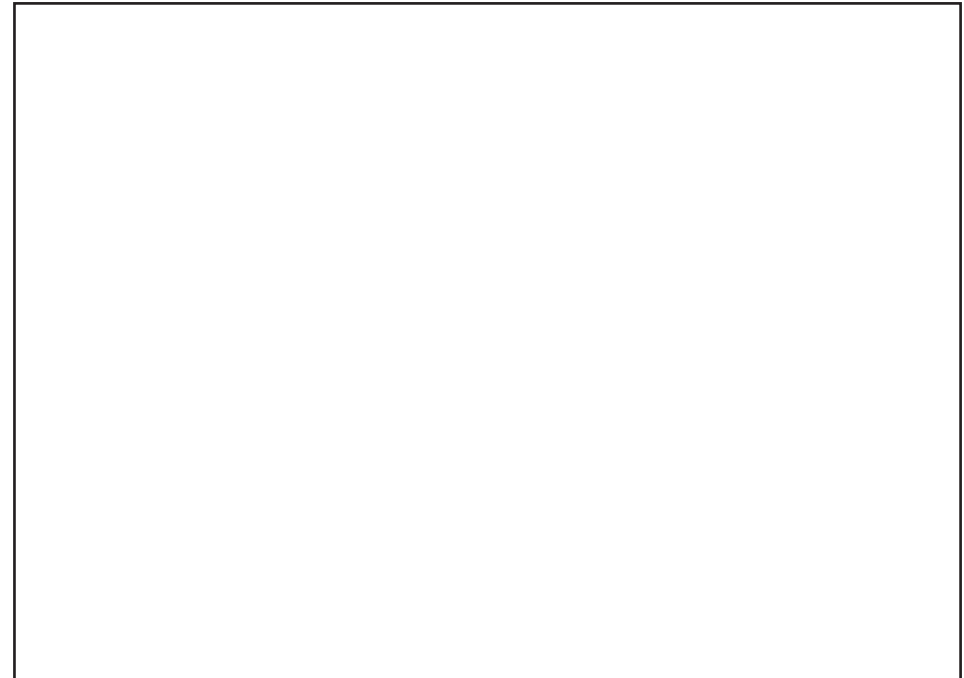


Dogs can jump. This dog wants to get the ball. He will run, jump up, catch it, and then bring it back to you!



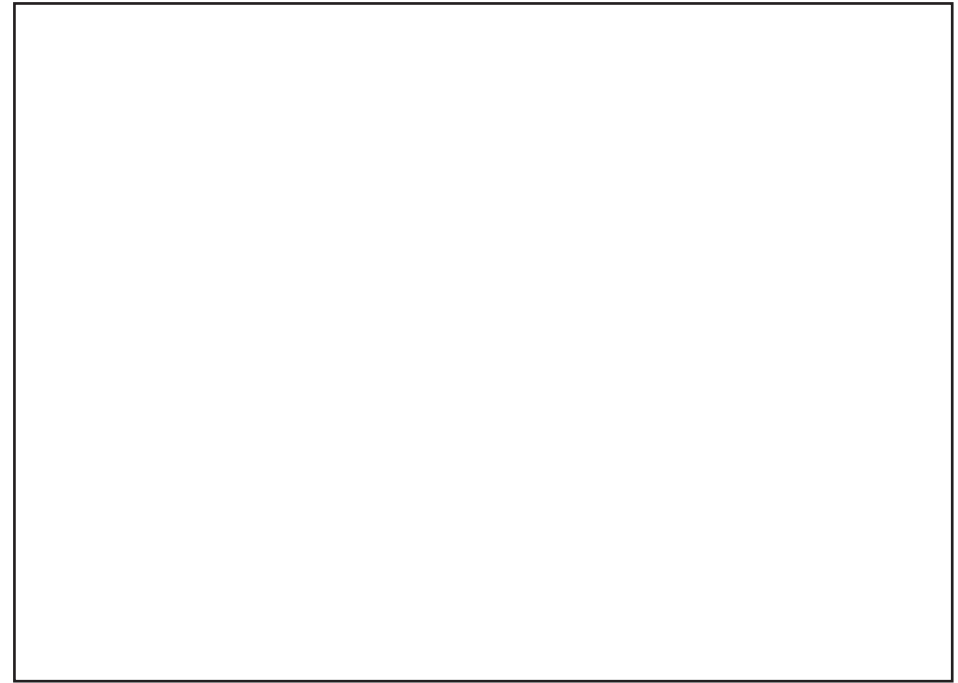

Jo is jumping in the long jump. She runs and jumps, stretching up as much as she can. She will land in the sand.



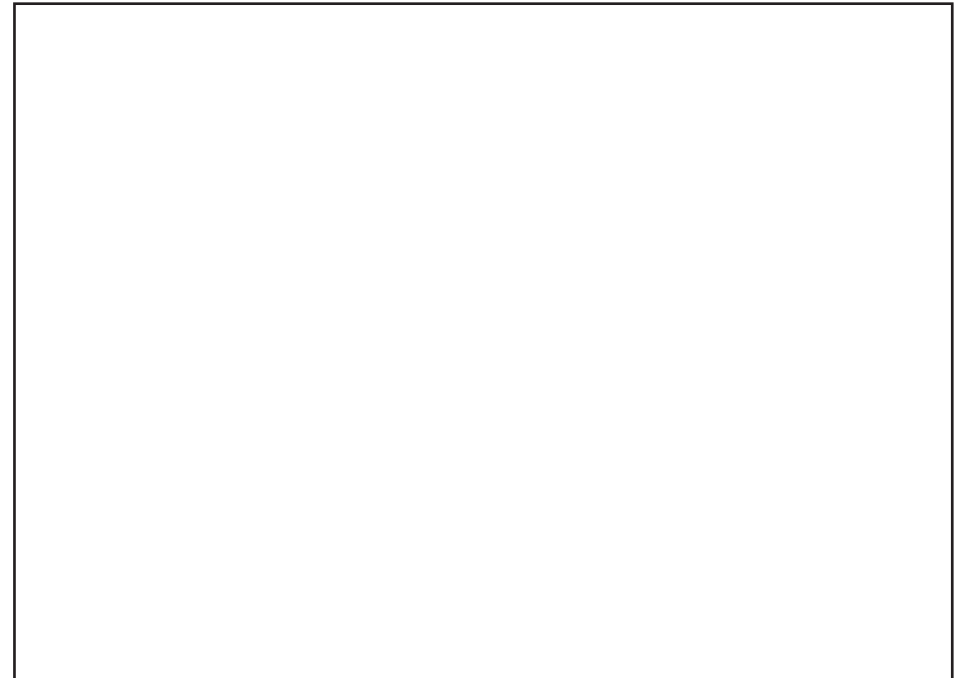

Step 5: Take the pancakes off the pan, and put them onto a plate.



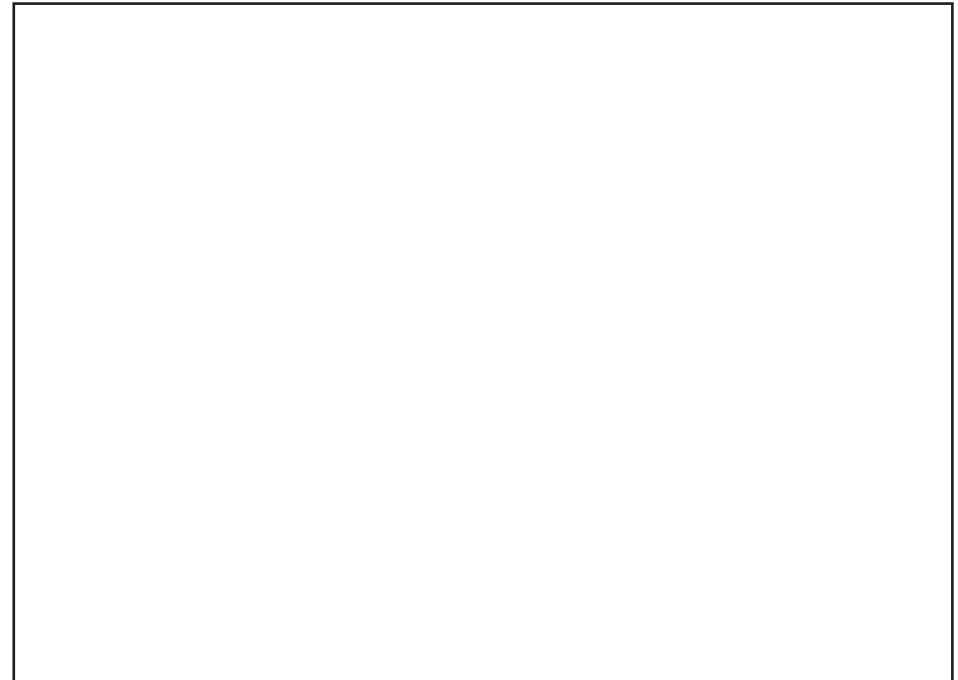

a lot of blending!

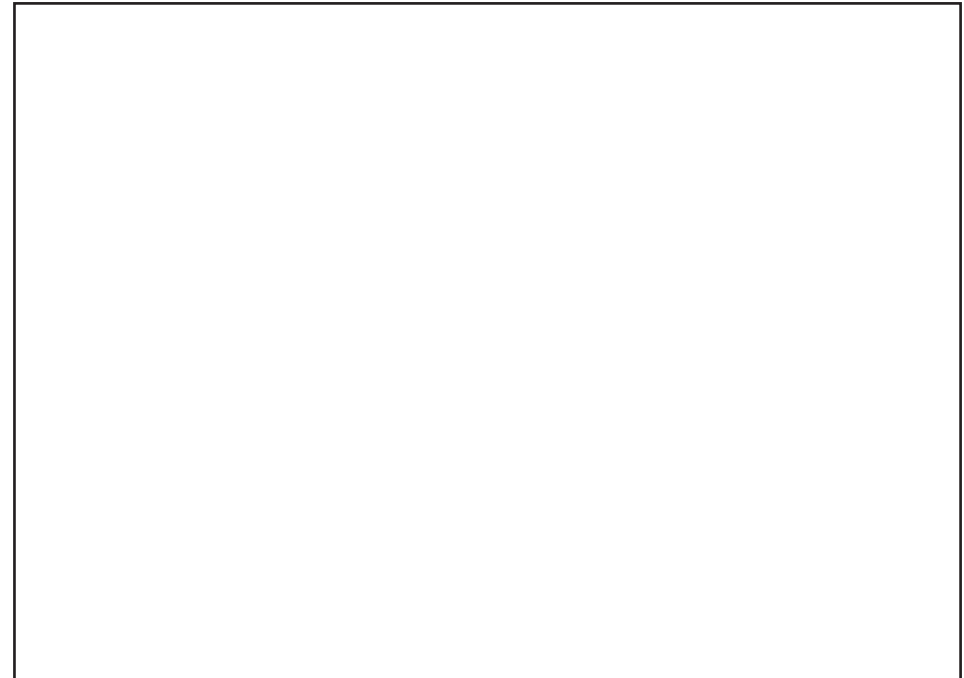


The last step is to add toppings. Lots of toppings go well with pancakes!



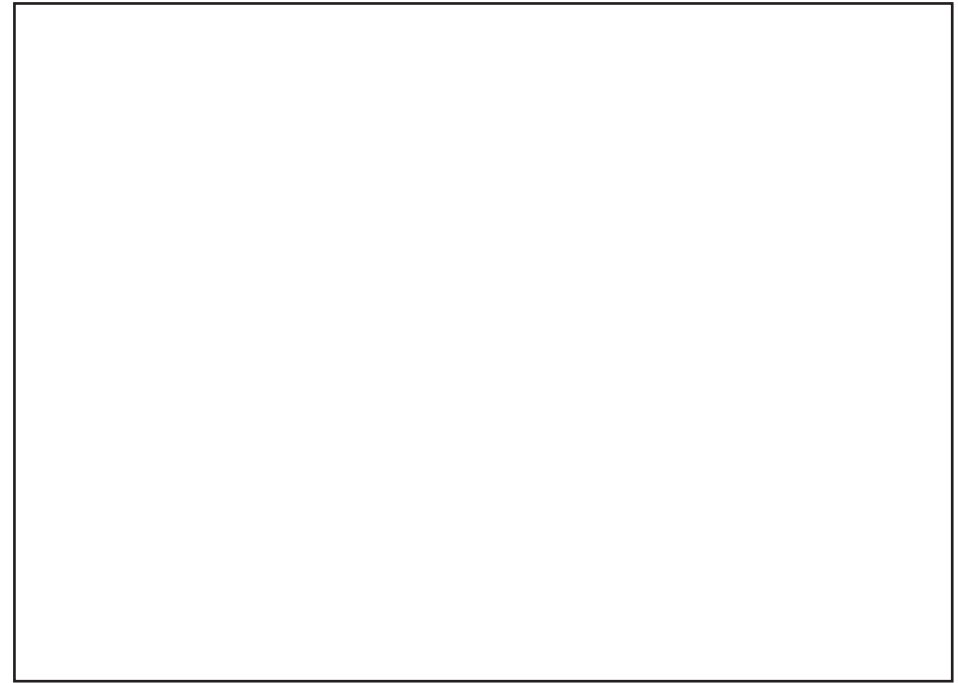

Step 4: Lift the edge of a pancake to check if the bottom is tanned. If it is, flip all the pancakes. This can make a mess, so getting help is the best plan!



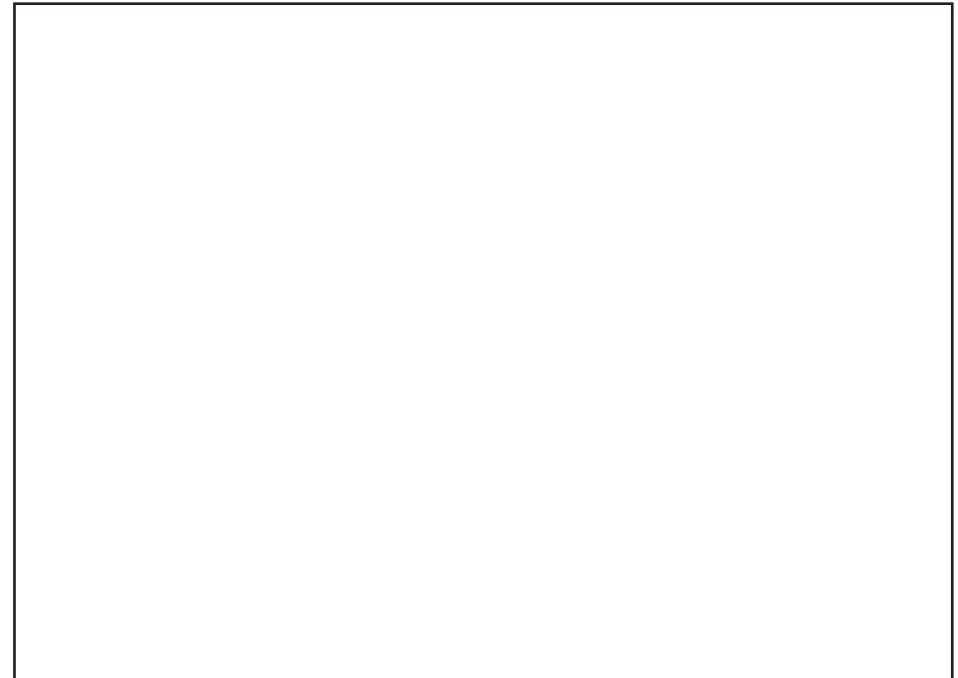

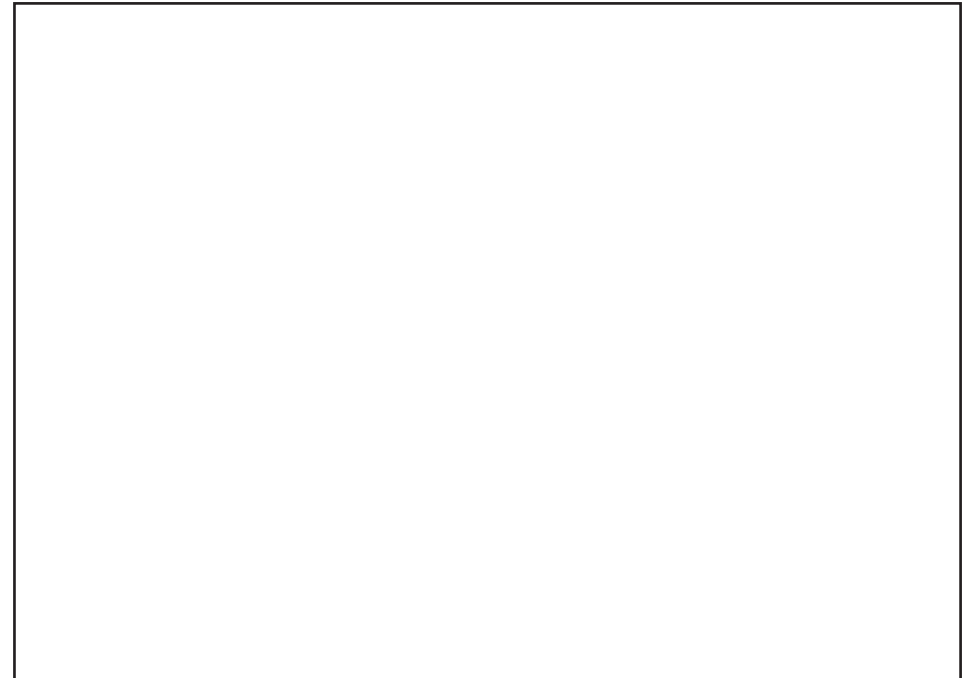


Cole wanted lunch, so Granddad lit the camp stove. The stove was hot, so it didn't take long to make lunch.



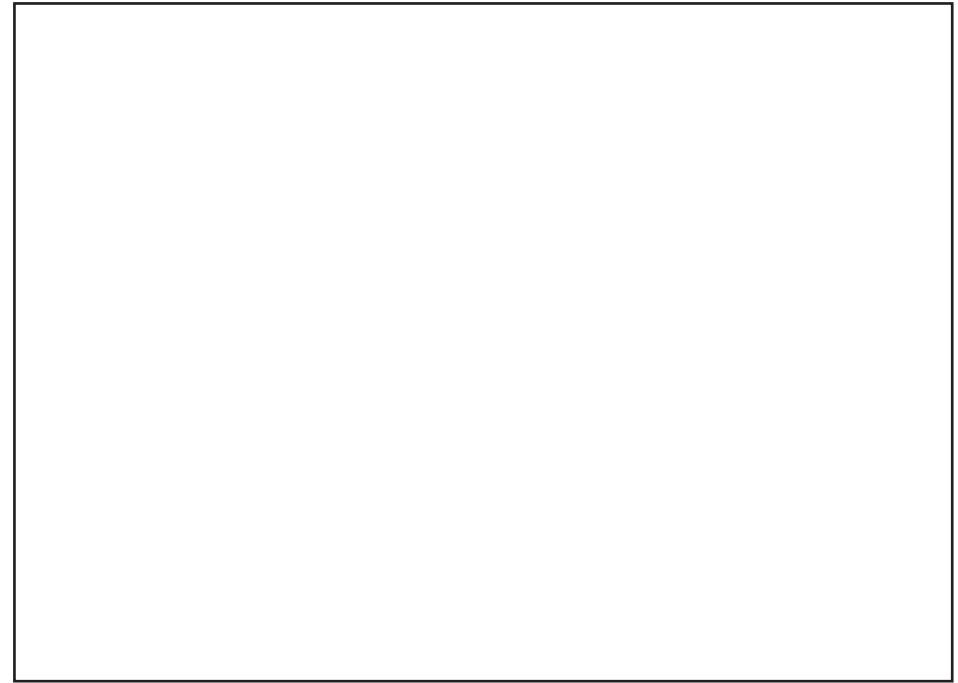

You can even turn, spin, and twirl on a bike. You can jump up, give the bike a spin, and then land! Turns and spins are hard, so start small.

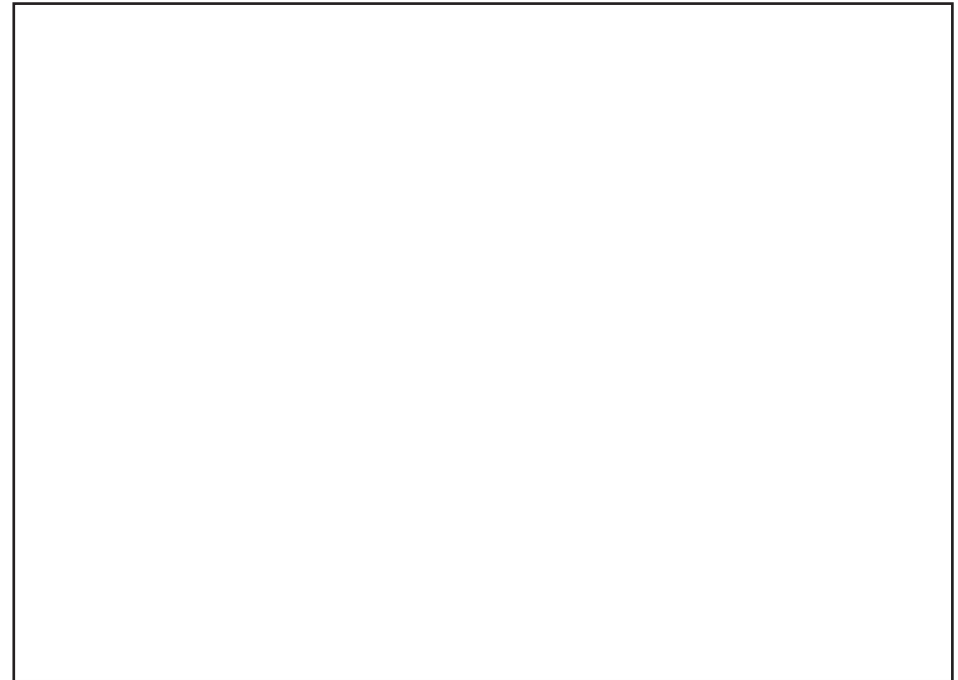


It takes focus and skill to turn, spin, and twirl.

Surfing on big waves also takes skill. You must twist and turn as you surf. Try not to get hit by the waves when they are curling!



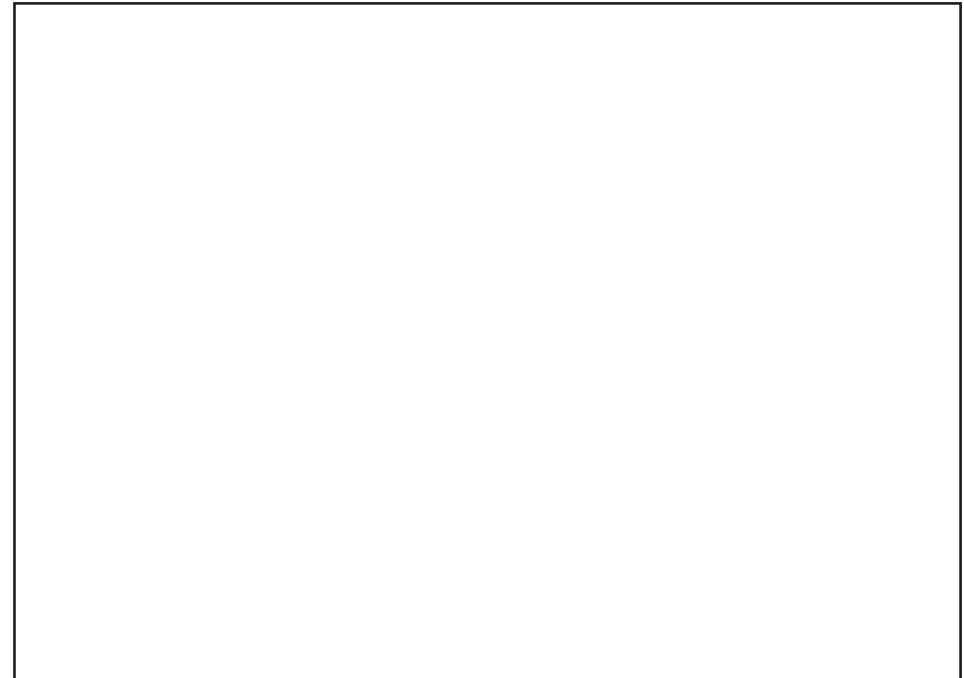

Turning, spinning, and twirling can be hard, but it can also be thrilling! You must be brave to go on this ride when its arms are twirling and spinning so fast!

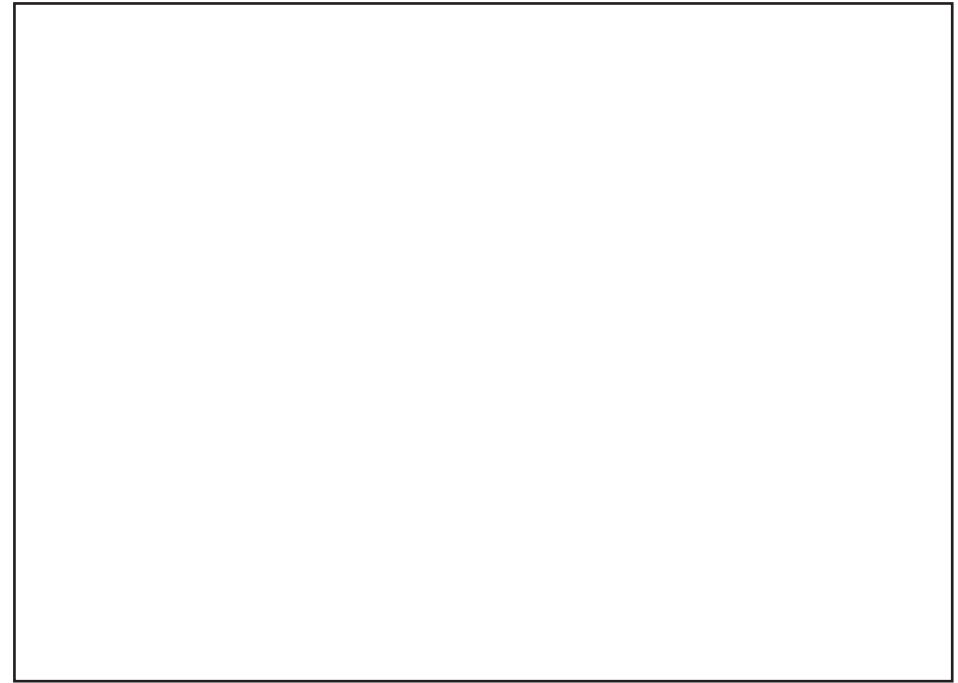

As these girls dive, they bend, turn, and spin. They are trying to finish the dive at the exact same time!

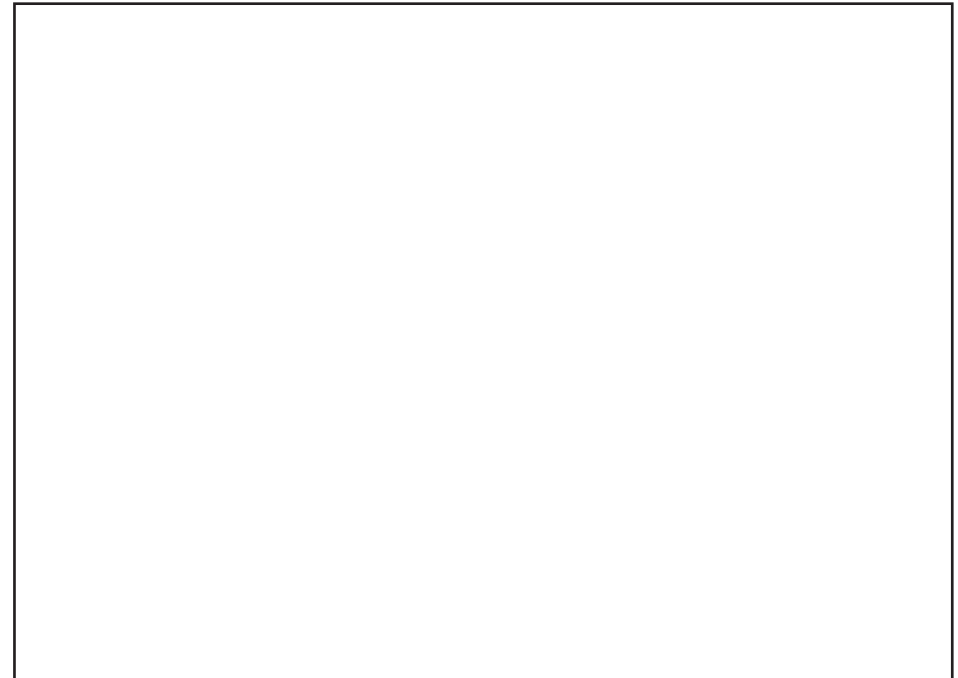


Spinning on ice skates is hard, but fun to watch. This girl is spinning so fast that she is a blur!

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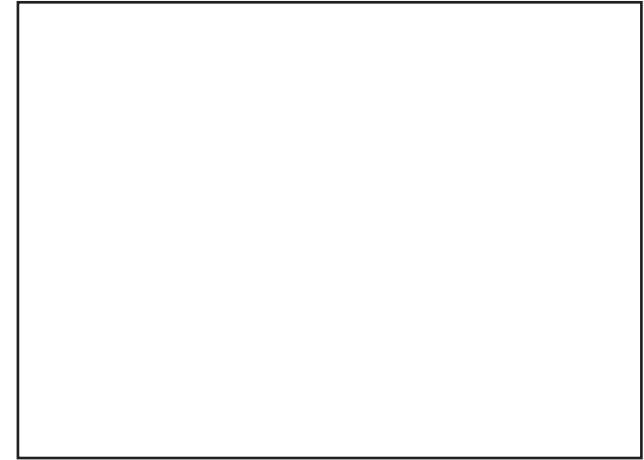

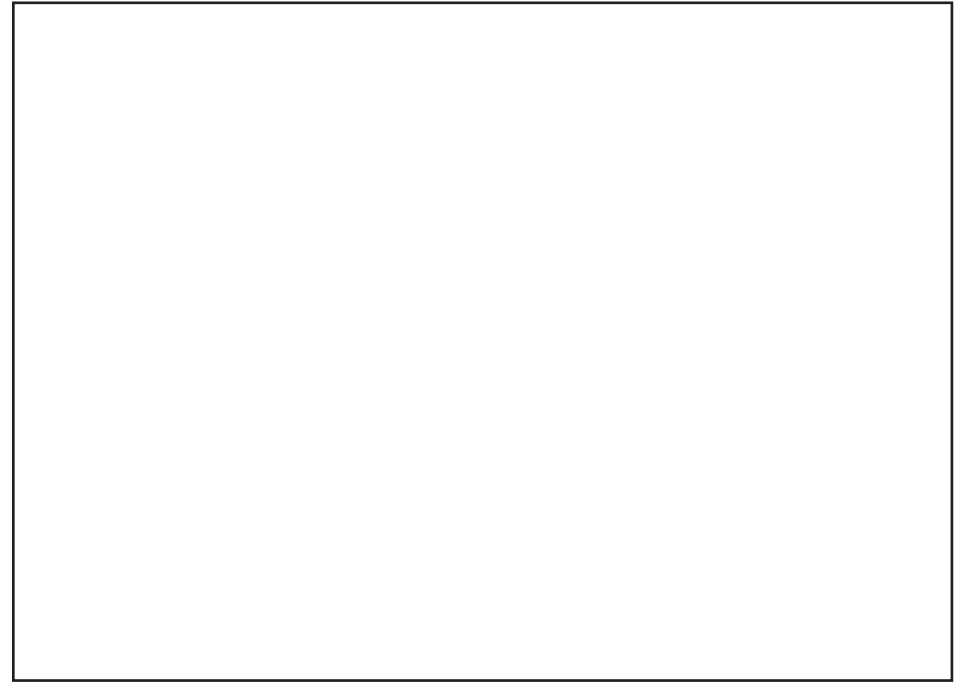

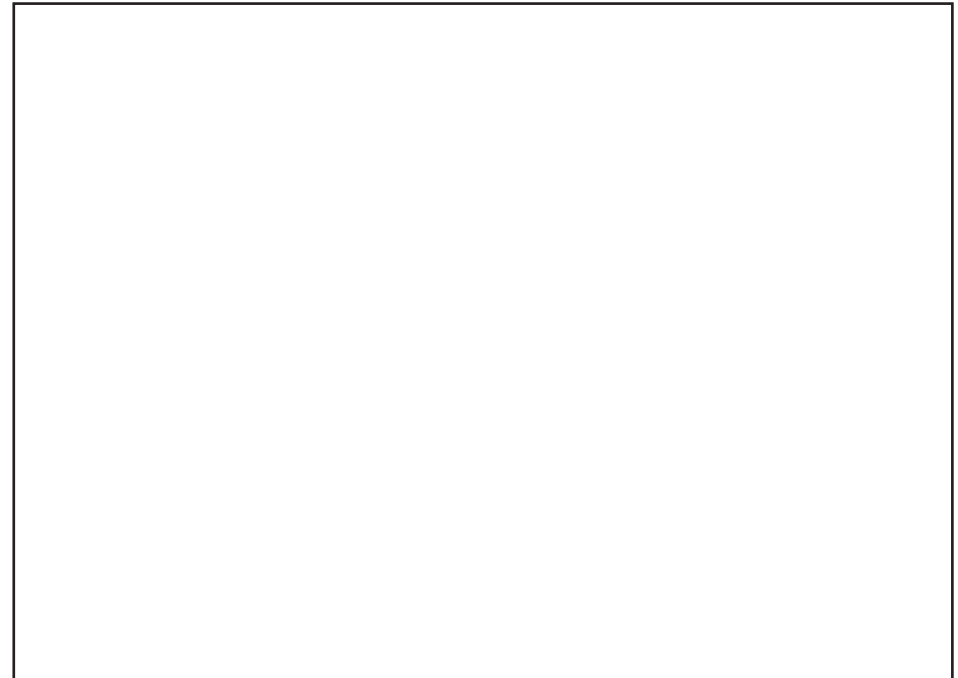

A marsh is a kind of wetland that is bursting with wildlife!



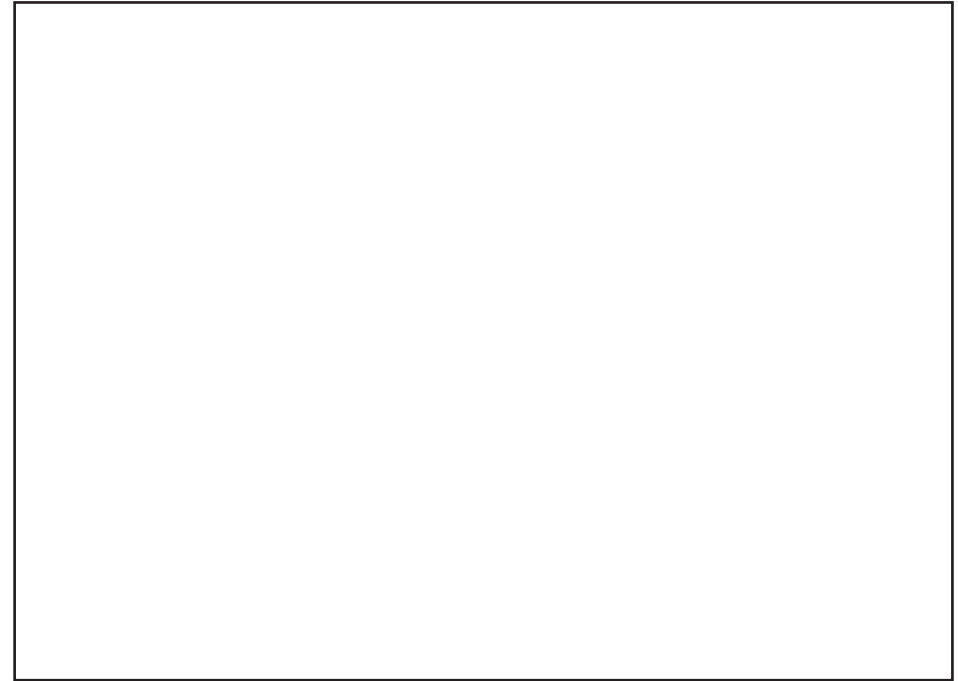

Wild cats, such as bold bobcats, like to visit marshes as well. Marshes hold a lot of small mammals to hunt.

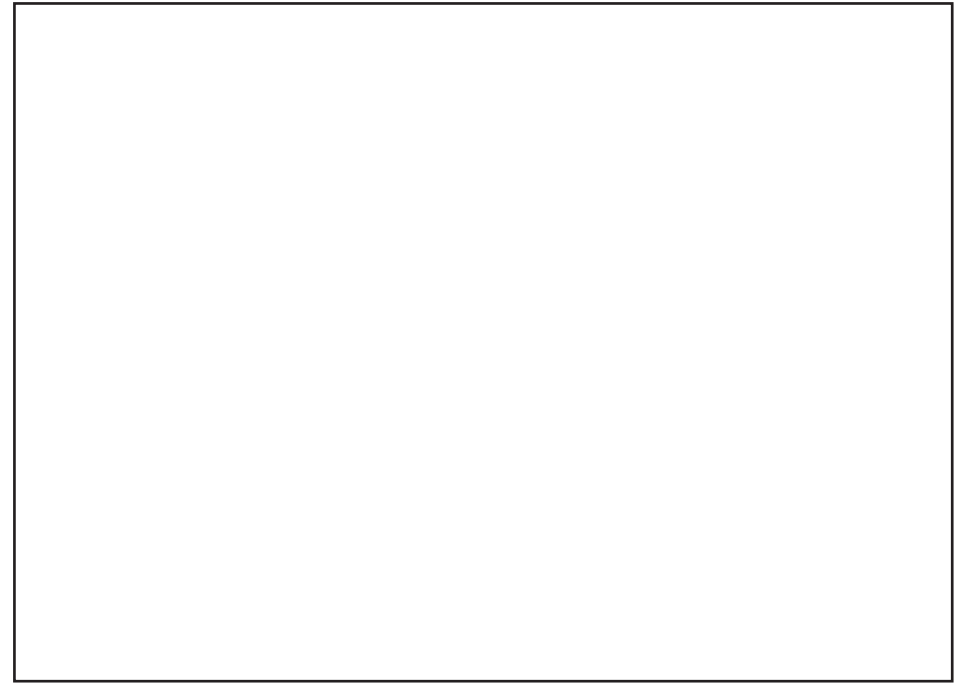

It can be fun to visit a marsh to spot insects. With luck, you can even find a dragonfly!

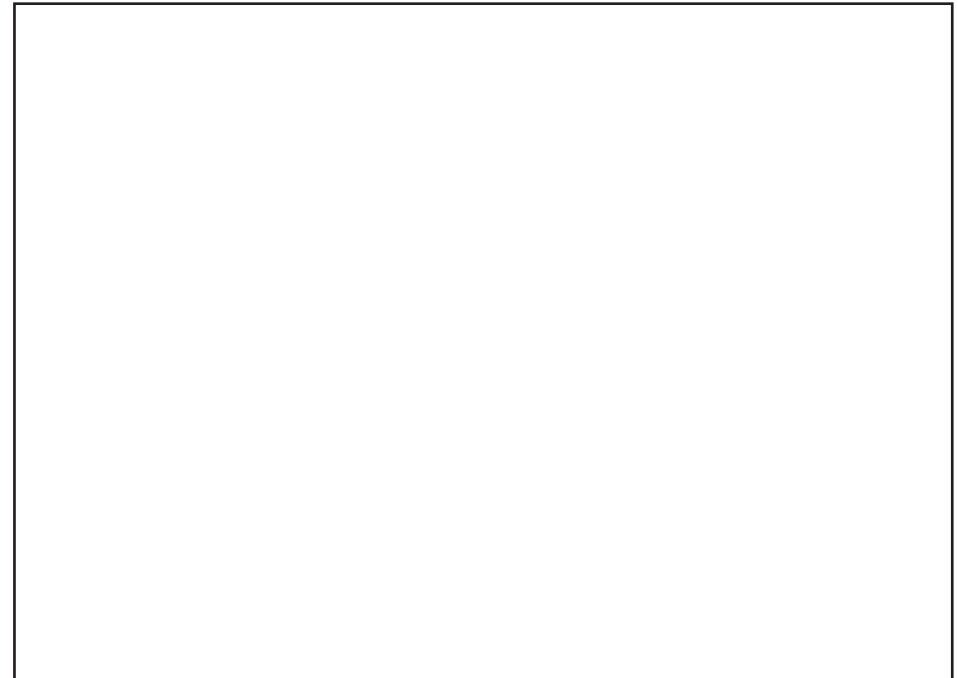


You can find grasses, bushes, and rushes in a marsh. These plants like the wetlands, so they thrive in a marsh!
